

David de Ferranti

As the World Bank's Regional Vice President for Latin America, David de Ferranti headed up a group with a \$25 billion loan portfolio, 700 professionals in 14 locations, and a \$160 million budget – for six years until his retirement from the Bank in 2005. Before that, he was responsible for the Bank's work globally in health, education, nutrition, population, and other social sectors, and earlier held other senior appointments. Previously, he

also held management positions at Rand, the original think tank, and in the U.S. government.

His research and writing have covered both developing countries and US domestic affairs. He holds a Ph.D. in Economics from Princeton University, and a Bachelors degree from Yale University.

His Board memberships have included: The Rockefeller Foundation (where he chaired the Finance Committee overseeing the investment of the Foundation's \$3 billion endowment); The Center on Budget and Policy Priorities (where he is the current Chair of the Board); Transparency International – USA; Technoserve, Inc.; The Inter-American Dialogue; The Pew Memorial Trust International Health Advisory Panel; The Center for Global Development Advisory Panel; The Lewis T. Preston Education Program; The Escuela Nueva Foundation; and The Partnership for Educational Revitalization in the Americas. He is an adjunct professor at Georgetown University.
