

Pierre Jacquet - Executive Director, Strategy, Agence Française de Développement

A graduate from the French *École Polytechnique* and *École Nationale des Ponts et Chaussées*, Pierre Jacquet has been since January 2002 executive director, in charge of strategy, and chief economist at the French Development Agency (AFD) in Paris. He was formerly deputy director of the French Institute of International Relations (IFRI) in Paris and chief editor of IFRI's quarterly review *Politique Etrangère*. He teaches international economics and chairs the department of economics and social sciences at *Ecole nationale des ponts et chaussées*. His fields of interest include globalization, international monetary and financial issues, the coordination of economic policies, trade policies and negotiations and development. His recent publications in English notably include : "Trade Rules and Global Governance: A Long Term Agenda" (co-authored with Jean Pisani-Ferry and Dominique Strauss-Kahn), *CEPII Working Paper 2000-22* (December 2000) ; *Economic policy co-ordination in the euro-zone: What has been achieved? What should be done?* (co-authored with Jean Pisani-Ferry), Centre for European Reform, January 2001; "Making EMU a success" (co-authored with Rudi Dornbusch), in *International Affairs* n° 1, 2000; "The case for joint management of exchange rate flexibility", *Working Paper 99-9* of the Institute for International Economics (co-authored with C. Fred Bergsten and O. Davanne), July 1999; and, co-authored with Wendy Dobson, *Financial liberalization at the WTO*, Institute for International Economics, 1998.

He is also a member of the *Conseil d'Analyse Economique*, an independent advisory panel created by the French Prime Minister in July, 1997. He belongs to the French *Société d'Economie Politique* and to the *Cercle des Economistes*, a club of 25 economists who contribute a daily editorial on a French radio channel, *Radio Classique*. He is also a guest professor in corporate programs at the French business school INSEAD and at CEDEP, the European center for executive education.
